Explanatory note

The objects of this regulation are—

- (a) to prescribe the maximum charges payable in relation to hazardous material incidents, and
- (b) to prescribe the charges payable for certain services performed by the Commissioner or by members of a fire brigade, and
- (c) to provide for the annual indexation of the charges referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b).

This regulation is made under the Fire and Rescue NSW Act 1989, including sections 40(4A) and 42(1).

[1] Section 3 Definitions

Insert in alphabetical order—

fire safety system report has the same meaning as in the Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021, section 51.

performance-based design brief has the same meaning as in the Environmental Planning and Assessment (Development Certification and Fire Safety) Regulation 2021.

Omit "Hazardous". Insert instead "Charges in relation to hazardous".

[3] Section 44(1)

Omit the subsection. Insert instead—

- (1) For the Act, section 40(4A), the prescribed charges for services performed in relation to a hazardous material incident are—
 - (a) the call out charge specified in Schedule 1, Part 1 for the incident, and
 - (b) if an item specified in Schedule 1, Part 2 is used or made available for use—the charge specified in the part for the item, and
 - (c) if an item specified in Schedule 1, Part 3 is hired or purchased—the charge specified in the part for the item, and
 - (d) if consumables are used—the charge specified in Schedule 1, Part 4 for the consumables.

[4] Section 44(4) and (5)

Omit "Part 2" wherever occurring. Insert instead "Part 3".

[5] Sections 45 and 45A

Omit section 45. Insert instead—

45 Additional services for which Commissioner entitled to payment

For the Act, section 42(1)(f), the following services are specified—

- (a) attending an event to monitor fire safety at the event,
- (b) rescue from a lift,
- (c) reptile handling.

45A Charges for certain other services

For the Act, section 42(1), the prescribed charge for performing a service specified in Schedule 2 is the charge specified in the schedule for the service.

Insert instead "For the Act, section 42(1), the prescribed charge for responding to an alarm discovered to be a false alarm is \$1,656".

[8] Sections 47 and 47A

Omit section 47. Insert instead—

47 Charges for attending event to monitor fire safety—the Act, s 42(1)

- (1) For the Act, section 42(1), the prescribed charges for attending an event to monitor fire safety at the event are—
 - (a) for each fire brigade member attending the event—the charge specified in Schedule 3, Part 1 for the member, and
 - (b) if an item specified in Schedule 3, Part 2 is hired or purchased—the charge specified in the part for the item, and
 - (c) if consumables are used—the charge specified in Schedule 3, Part 3 for the consumables.
- (2) If an item is purchased and, in the Commissioner's opinion, the item may be reused, the prescribed charge for the item under Schedule 3, Part 2 must be reduced by the amount the Commissioner considers reasonable, having regard to the extent to which the item may be reused.

47A Indexation of charges—the Act, ss 40(4A) and 42(1)

- (1) This section applies to each charge prescribed by this part.
- (2) The charge must be adjusted on 1 July each year using the following formula—

adjusted charge =
$$cost \times \frac{A}{B}$$

where-

A is the Public Sector Wage Price Index total hourly rates of pay, excluding bonuses, for the March quarter for the year.

B is the Public Sector Wage Price Index total hourly rates of pay, excluding bonuses, for the March quarter for the previous year.

cost means—

- (a) for the first time the charge is adjusted under this section—the charge referred to in subsection (1), or
- (b) otherwise—the charge referred to in subsection (1) as last adjusted under this section.
- (3) Fire and Rescue NSW must, before 1 July each year, publish notice of the adjusted charge on Fire and Rescue NSW's website.
- (4) In this section—

Public Sector Wage Price Index means the Wage Price Index (Public Sector) for New South Wales published by the Australian Bureau of Statistics.
